The college has been engaged in activities for the welfare of the society by conducting awareness programmes on health and sanitation, preventive measures, special camps, celebration of important days and festivals for communal harmony
2	Red Ribbon Club	A unit of RRC is functioning in our institution with the aim of serving community through creating awareness about HIV infections, conducting blood donation camps, etc. Special camps are organised by the unit for the collection of blood and blood group identification.
3	Youth Red Cross	Youth Red Cross unit of SKHMC is the main constituent of Indian Red Cross Society. The unit undertakes community oriented programs like health education, medical camps, road safety, fire and safety programs with demonstration and disaster management.
4	Blood Donation Forum	Blood donation campaigns are organised by the RRC and YRC units of SKHM. The samples are preserved in the blood banks and used whenever necessity arises for any individual in the society. Students and faculties actively participate in the blood donation.
5	Mother and Child health care	As a community oriented initiative, MCH unit of SKHMC aims at improving the quality of life of mother and child through a network of health care activities. Programs for Women's health care are adopted by the unit by providing awareness on personal hygiene, nutrition, breast feeding and menstruation.
6	Science Forum	Science Forum unit in our institution works in collaboration with the NGO- Tamil Nadu Science Forum with the aim of providing welfare measures and health education to the rural based community. Medical camps are organised by the unit for screening of the diseases.
7.	Learning Disability	LD is an initiative which deals with the problem encountered by parents and teachers in school. A proper identification, correction will help in producing a healthy generation which in long term produce a healthy society.

1.	Non communicable disease unit	NCD is a growing health problem in India. Life style disorders like Hypertension, Diabetes Mellietus, Depression, etc are





		more prevailing among the people in Kanniyakumari district. Our institution have NCD unit which has the expertise in dealing with the problem. NCD unit conducts disease screening programs, health education activities, free medical camps, women's health care programs for the benefit of the society. Hygiene, diet and significance of exercises are also addressed by the activities of NCD unit of SKHMC.
2.	Peripheral Health Care	The PHC numbering 27 deals with the problems related to health in the nearby areas. It helps us to deal with the individual at their own places. The PHC's in collaboration with the NGO's like Sevabharathi, Malar, Good Vision every week throughout the length and breadth of Kanniyakumari District. People residing at hilly, rural areas are mostly benefitted through these Peripheral Health Centres.
3.	Cancer Care/Palliative care	Palliative care is an initiative in co-operation with Pallium India. The initiative helps us to deal with poor section of the society where effective as well as economic services are provided. The services provided cater to the local person who needs to travel more than 50kms to reach the city. Cancer care measures are undertaken by the unit for the society by providing health awareness, screening of disease and terminal care.
4.	Health Awareness	Health Awareness programme is initiated to identify the different types of disease suffered by the individuals in the society. This will help us to focus on the problem encountered and help in taking necessary action to address the problem. Awareness campaigns are conducted regularly by the institution by providing health education regarding the diseases, its prevention and management. Nutritional educations are also provided to the public.
5.	Women's Health	Women's Health defines a healthy society. Only a healthy woman can give a healthy child. To address the problem of women an effective mechanism is put in place. This will help in addressing the issues of women effectively. Women's health care screening and awareness programmes are conducted by the various units of SKHMC.
6.	School Health Program	The school health program deals with schools in our society. It deals with identifying the problem of the child at the earliest which will provide for healthy child. Regular school health programs are conducted for the welfare of school children.
7.	Free Medical Kit Distribution	As a part of improving the community health, free medical kit is distributed to the rural based community for emergency management. The medicine kits are provided through the volunteers of NGO like Sevabharthi and Malar for about nine village blocks of Kanniyakumari district. Free medical kit distribution helps the community to prevent and manage diseases to an extent as a first aid measure.

Institution has leveraged its location for the services of the community through the following initiatives:

School Health Programme

To identify and resolve the health issues of the children at school level, we offer school health programmes in the neighborhood schools of the institution spread around Kanniyakumari district aimed at conducting health screening and awareness programme. In this programme, a team of teachers, PG students and Internees used to visit the nearby Schools and provide awareness to the students, Teachers, Parents and other staff about the health issues, need for preventive mechanisms, hygiene, sanitation, nutrition, salient features of Homeopathy, health education etc. Significant deviations if any found among the students through the health screening are communicated to the parents through their teachers and treatments are given accordingly in the Collegiate Hospital. Efforts are also being made through school health programme to identify learning and behavioural problems of children of age group up to 13 years. These students are directed to the Learning Disability speciality clinic of the institution for further management.

Health Survey

SKHMC has adopted various measures to identify the health issues of the society, the factors influencing the diseases, preventive strategies and to implement curative measures. As a process, specific area from Grama Panchayat /Village is first identified with the help of officials/personals of the Panchayat concerned. Each and every house of the locality is visited by the students under the guidance of faculty and necessary data in detail are collected in a prescribed format. Thus the collected data are analysed and patients identified if any are referred to collegiate hospital for treatment. As a follow up procedure, the institution conducts medical camps and awareness programmes on health care. The collected data are thereafter handed over to the officials of Health Department. Similar Health Surveys are also conducted by the Internees as a part of extension activity of the institution. The Head of the Department of Community Medicine is the Co-ordinator of Health Survey.

National Service Scheme

As an affiliated College of the Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai, Sarada Krishna Homoeopathic Medical College, Kulasekharam has established a NSS Unit. Its avowed objective is to develop the personality of the students and provide service to the community based on the cardinal principle of NSS that it is organized by the students themselves, and both students and teachers through their combined participation in social service, get a sense of involvement in the tasks of national development.

The college unit has been actively engaged in activities for the welfare of the society such as awareness programme on health and sanitation; preventive measures, conducting medical camps, Special camps, personality development programmes for volunteers, campus cleaning, observance of health related days, celebration of national important days and festivals for communal harmony in collaboration with Community Medicine Department and other unit reaping cognizable results every time.

Youth Red Cross

Youth Red Cross unit of Sarada Krishna Homoeopathic Medical College is the main constituent of the Indian Red Cross society, Tamilnadu .The YRC undertakes community oriented programs like health education, medical camp, road safety week, blood donation

camp, programmes on importance of Hand Wash, observance of important days, campus cleaning, fire fighting demo, relief work during emergencies, participation in disaster management, etc. for the social welfare.

Red Ribbon Club

The college has established a Unit of Red Ribbon Club (RRC) to create an awareness among the young generation about the HIV infection and blood donation. The RRC of the college unit undertakes, blood group identification, camps on blood donation, awareness programmes on World AIDS Day and other important days in collaboration with other units.

Medical Camps

Sarada Krishna Homoeopathic Medical College is situated in Kulasekharam of Kanniyakumari District surrounded by a typical mixture of group of people namely hilly, rural, tribal, costal, socially and economically deprived sections of the society and victims of natural calamities, etc. The people visit the collegiate hospital for homoeopathic treatment belongs to the length and breadth of the district and from neighboring state. The requisitions of the members of the voluntary organisation as well as individuals have forced to start up a series of medical and preventive camps throughout the district mainly in rural areas at their door step. Hence, in collaboration with various extension initiatives of the college Community Medicine Department conducts homoeopathic free medical and preventive camps mainly in rural areas of the district. A college medical team consisting of medical officers, PG scholars and interns will be deputed to conduct medical camp. They conduct necessary medical check-up and dispense free medicines. Follow up camps are also made according to necessity under direction to take continous treatment from the Collegiate Hospital. Pamphlets /leaflets /brochures related to public health, homeopathy and collegiate hospital etc. are also distributed in medical camp.

Pain and Palliative Care Centre

Analysis of patient records in the collegiate hospital revealed that there is a rapid growth of patient visited for cancer treatment from our neighbourhood villages for Homoeopathic treatment. As a follow up measure the institution has initiated steps to establish a Pain and Palliative Care Unit in the Collegiate Hospital for the treatment, terminal care of cancer affected people and awareness programme. The unit conducts awareness programme and classes throughout the Kanniyakumari District in association with NGOs. It also conducts screening programmes aimed at early detection of cancer cases, homoeopathic treatment to cancer patients, home visits to affected people for remedy, and cancer care through peripheral health centers. Pallium Kulasekharam routinely visits the unit twice in month for expertise care support. As an community oriented service initiative, the Palliative Care Unit of the college hospital extends its service to cancer prone areas namely Colachel, Kovalam (Kanniyakumari) and Manakudy through the Peripheral Centers. The performance has proved that the initiative is very successful. Amendments have already been made for admitting patients demanding emergency management with the intension for assessing the scope of homeopathy in management of cancer.

Epidemic control cell

Whenever there is an epidemic outbreak anywhere in the neighbor hood villages of our institution the epidemic control cell will reach over to the place and make a detailed study of the prevalent diseases for finding the "Genus Epidemics". It will be instantly followed by the

distribution of prophylactic medicine to the people of the affected areas by conducting preventive camps. Necessary feed-back studies are also conducted to evaluate the efficacy of the prophylactic medicine by the epidemic control cell.

Mother and Child Health Care

As a community oriented measure, Mother and Child Health Care Unit of SKHMCH aims at reducing the maternal, neonatal and under-five mortality and morbidity rate so as to enhance the quality of life. MCH serves women, adolescents and their families through a network of health care facilities and programmes. It also improves access to skill development, provides information on various health related problems, especially of women, there by enhance knowledge and offers services to the public by free medical camps. It make the women aware on the importance of menstruation, personal hygiene, nutrition, breast feeding, pre and post natal care etc by conducting various programs. It conducts Breast feeding week every year and awareness classes at various rural centres spread around the Kanniyakumari district.

Science Forum

The Tamil Nadu Science Forum, a Non-Governmental Organisation (NGO) extends its service to Sarada Krishna Hornoeopathic Medical College with the aim of providing various welfare measures to the rural based community. The activities includes conducting medical camps, scientific seminars, sky watching programmes and awareness classes, realizing 'World Science Day' etc with in the college and in rural areas.

Non-Communicable Disease Unit

Non Communicable Diseases like Hypertension, Diabetics, Depression and anxiety, etc are more prevailing among the people in Kanniyakumari District and hence an NCD Unit is established in the hospital by the Community Medicine Department in collaboration with other departments. The NCD unit conducts medical camps, health screening and awareness programs for the people.

Unnat Bharat Abhiyan

Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA), a flagship programme of Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD), Govt. of India, is an opportunity to enable faculty and students of higher educational institutions to work with the people of rural India in identifying development challenges and evolving appropriate solutions for accelerating sustainable growth of village. Sarada Krishna Homoeopathic Medical College has voluntarily joined UBS II as a nodal agency to take part in transformational change in rural development process by adoption of villages as per the directions of Ministry of AYUSH, letter No.F.14-42/2017-CCH/28926-2943, dated 09-02-2018. The college has adopted five panachayat namely Aruvikarai, Ayakkode, Vellancode, Mancode, and Puliyoorsalai Village Panchayat of Kanniyakuamri District under the UBA for the year 2018-19.

Various programmes undertaken by the college in the adopted villages are sanitation, solidliquid waste management, health education, health care-medical camps, preventive camps and School Health Education Programme etc. These activities are carried out by the interns, P.G.s and Faculty, in collaboration with the Department of Community Medicine and other unit.

'Swachh Bharath' Activities

'Swachh Bharat Abhiyan' is an initiative of the Government of India to make India as a clean India. The campaign involves the construction of latrines, promoting sanitation programmes in the rural areas, cleaning streets, roads and changing the infrastructure of the country to lead the country ahead. As a health science institution, Sarada Krishna Homoeopathic Medical College involves in the following Swatchh Bharath Activities:

Cleaning Drive

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- Swasthya Rakshan Programme
- Swatch Bharat Summer Internship Programme
- Swatchatha Hi Seva
- Swatchhta Pakhwada
- Institutional Swatchata Ranking

Institution undertakes cleaning programmes in collaboration with its various extension units. Under the Swasthya Rakshan Programme, the Community Medicine Department adopted five villages namely Pechipparai, Kadayalumoodu, Manjalumoodu, Melpuram and a remote place in Colachel and undertakes health survey, health awareness programme, medical camp, cleaning programme and School Sanitation Campaign.

Under Swatch Bharat Summer Internship Programme, 8 groups of students under the team leaders adopted villages in southern district of Tamilnadu. The following activities are carried out in the adopted villages namely awareness campaign for better sanitation practices like using of toilet, hand washing, health and hygiene.

In Swatchatha Hi Seva programmes, our students carried out wall paintings illustrating the need for sanitation, health education, and cleaning for the public.

Similarly, in Swatchhta Pakhwada initiative, students have participated in programme on sanitation for the community with trainings for hand wash and street plays were conducted by the students making aware to the public about the importance of sanitation and hygienic measures. For the evaluation of the benefits of the community by Swachh Bharath programs our institution has participated in swatchhata ranking scheme namely "Swachh Survekshan Grameen 2018"

Peripheral Health Centres

Sarada Krishna Homoeopathic Medical College provides community oriented peripheral health care centres for the rural based community. About 27 peripheral health centres in collaboration with the NGO's like Sevabharathi, Malar, Good visiori are functioning throughout the length and breadth of Kanniyakumari District. Peripheral health centres runs on every week with the provision of providing homoeopathic care at the door step of the people.
